

Documentation of statistics for Recipients of subsidy for private day-care 2020



1 Introduction

The statistics illustrates how many who chooses private day-care or care for their own child. These statistics are comparable from 2004 and onwards.

2 Statistical presentation

The statistics is an annual inventory of the number of children and the number of families receiving subsidies for private day-care or for care of their own children. The statistics are grouped by municipalities.

2.1 Data description

The statistics illustrates private day-care (§ 80 og § 86) for children and families in Danish Municipalities. The statistics is measured on the first wednesday of october.

The statistics is dividede into Muncipalities, type of grants and affected.

4 Relevance

On the basis of feedback from the users, Statistics Denmark are from 2020 publishing information about private daycare on CPR (Micro) level. This information is published on the Division for Research Service.

The primary uncertainty related to the statistics comes from typing errors made by reporters in the Municipalities.

5.1 Overall accuracy

The primary uncertainty related to the statistics comes from typing errors in the reporting from Municipalities.

5.3 Non-sampling error

A source of uncertainty is the reporting errors from Municipalities.

5.4 Quality management

Statistics Denmark follows the recommendations on organisation and management of quality given in the Code of Practice for European Statistics (CoP) and the implementation guidelines given in the Quality Assurance Framework of the European Statistical System (QAF). A Working Group on Quality and a central quality assurance function have been established to continuously carry through control of products and processes.

5.5 Quality assurance

Statistics Denmark follows the principles in the Code of Practice for European Statistics (CoP) and uses the Quality Assurance Framework of the European Statistical System (QAF) for the implementation of the principles. This involves continuous decentralized and central control of products and processes based on documentation following international standards. The central quality assurance function reports to the Working Group on Quality. Reports include suggestions for improvement that are assessed, decided and subsequently implemented.

5.6 Quality assessment

The data is gathered through a dialogue with Muncipalities. Therefore, the quality of the data is considered high.

5.7 Data revision - policy

Statistics Denmark revises published figures in accordance with the <u>Revision Policy for Statistics</u> <u>Denmark</u>. The common procedures and principles of the Revision Policy are for some statistics supplemented by a specific revision practice.

5.8 Data revision practice

Just final figures are published.

6 Timeliness and punctuality

The statistics is published around five months after the reference period. The statistics is published with no delays.

6.2 Punctuality

Publishing of the statstics with data from 2020 was on the 15 of marts 2021.

There is comparable data for the number of children receiving subsidies from 2004 until today.
