Statistics on music schools aims to show the activity of music schools in Denmark. The statistics are compiled for the 2012/13 season and onwards by Statistics Denmark. The statistic is published in 'Nyt fra Danmarks Statistik' and in Statistikbanken.dk.

The determination of activity at music schools is performed in the following areas shown below.

- 1. *Ratios for music schools*. The table with the figures for music schools shows background information for each music schools. Data is based on reports from music schools.
- 2. *Students activity*. The table of student activity shows statements of pupils' participation in instrumental classes, ensemble, preparatory school team and a number of other like some music schools offer. In addition the number of students who are on the waiting list is published and it is possible to see an inventory of talent students. Talent Students are a subset of the music school's students. There is also a statement of MGK-pupils and this statement is an independent statement, i.e. MGK-pupils is not a subset of the school school's students. The table is based on data derived from extracts from music school's delivery system.
- 3. *Štaff Statement*. The table shows a summary of the various music schools staff group. Data derived from the schema reports from music schools.
- 4. *Economic indicators*. The table shows the figures for schools of music economy.
