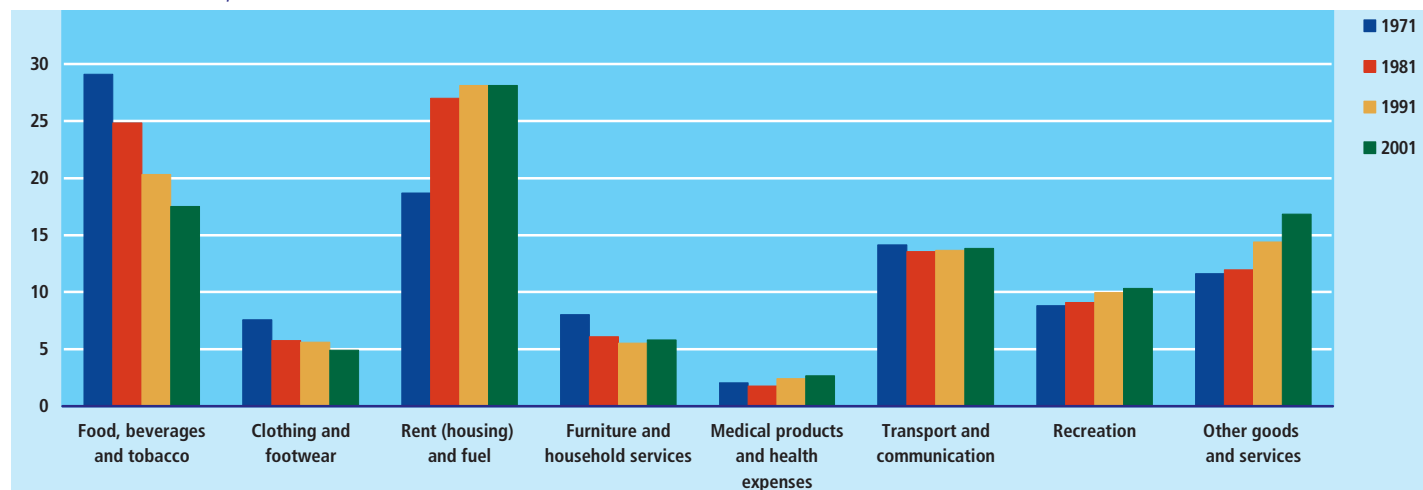

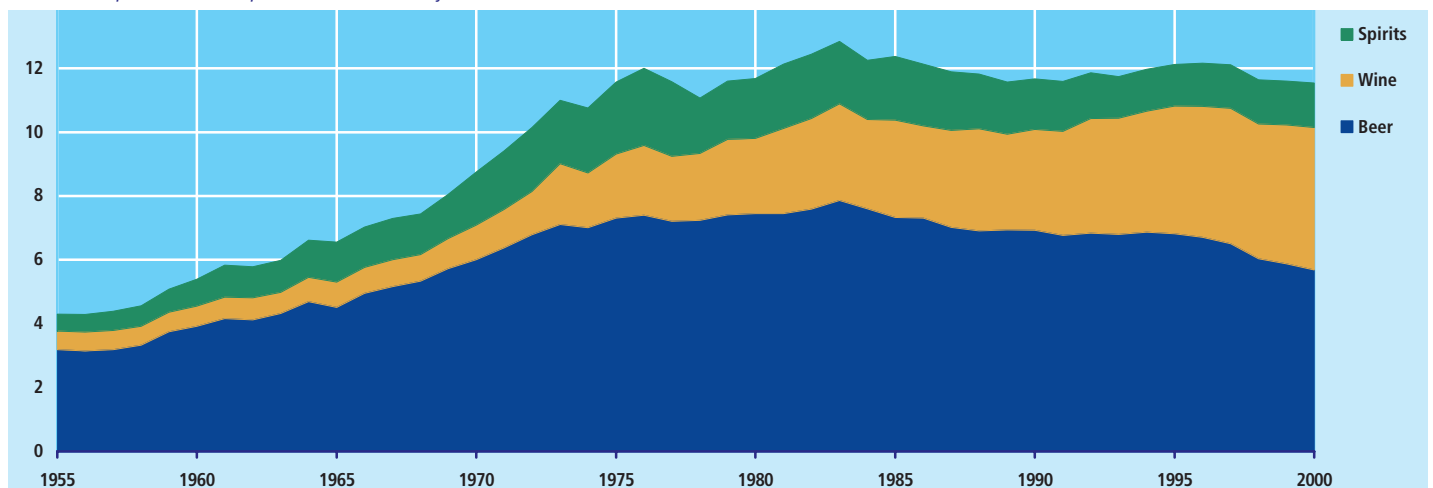

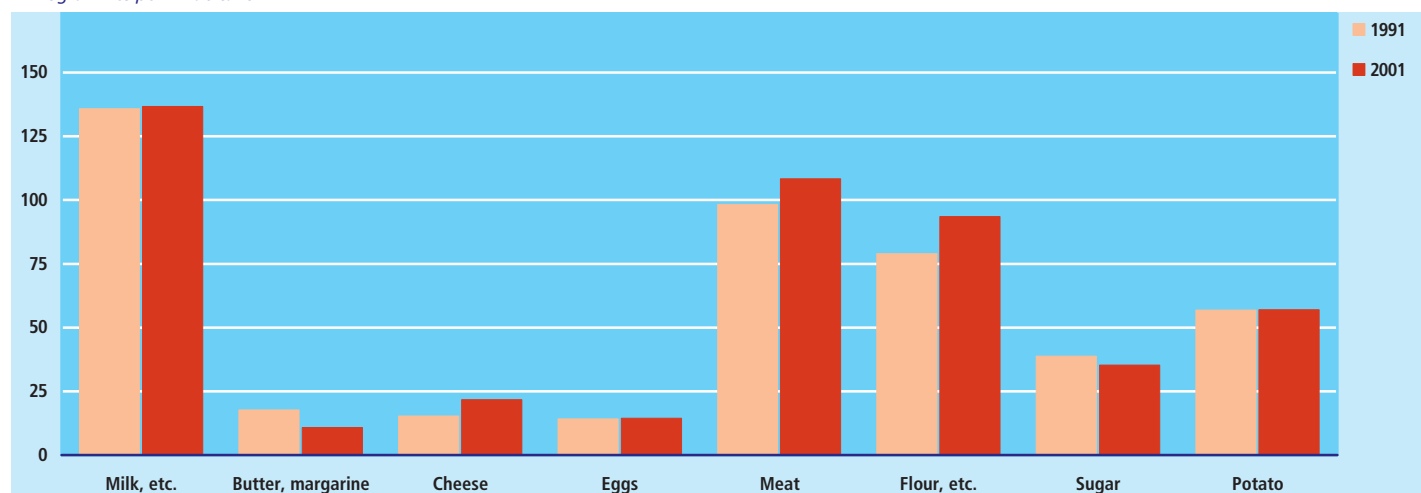

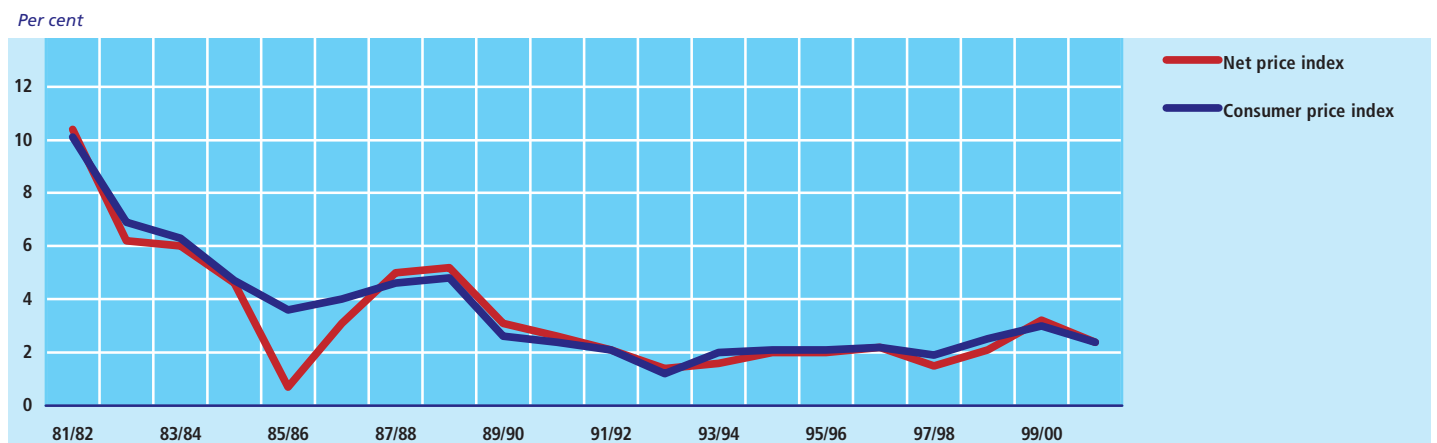

## Annual percentage change in the consumer price index and net price index



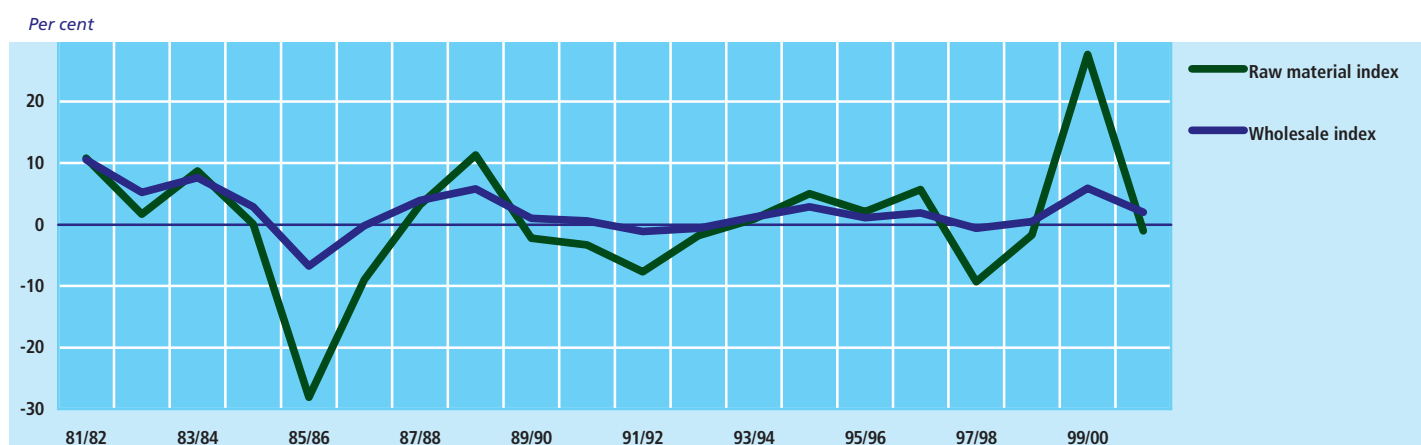
